January Meeting - Aggie Moms is pleased to have Mr. J. David McMahon from TAMU Career Center Services. This is a meeting specially organized for our students, so moms, please bring your students with you to the meeting! Dads are welcome too! This will be a very informative talk to help your students develop their job search skills and find not only full-time jobs when they graduate, but also Internships and Co-op jobs before they graduate. The Career Center helps students understand the hiring process – from determining the job opportunities for their major, to how to differentiate themselves when dealing with employers, to how to evaluate offers and negotiate salaries.



The November meeting featured three terrific student speakers, Ryan Montgomery, Kai Jones and David Trigg from three great student organizations.

Ryan Montgomery, a '17 Construction Science major, serves as Director of Development, for **CARPOOL** (carpool.tamu.edu). CARPOOL is a student-run 501(c)(3) charitable organization that provides free, safe rides home on Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights from 10pm to 3am. Students who use the service range from girls needing a ride home from the library at night to students who have had too much to drink on a football weekend. The next speaker was Kai Jones, a '17 Industrial Distribution major and Recruitment Executive for the **Big Event:** (bigevent.tamu.edu): Started in 1982, the Big Event is a tradition 33 years strong. This event is the largest single day service event in the United States; TAMU students work on thousands of local Bryan/College Station projects on a single day. Projects include house repair, park cleanup, etc., basically anything needed in the

community. This is a way for the student body to express their gratitude to the Bryan/College Station community that supports Texas A&M; it has been replicated on 110 campuses worldwide.

The final speaker was David Trigg '15. David is a former Corps Commander and serves as a **Maroon Coat** for the Texas A&M Foundation (txamfoundation.com): 2015 marks the 8th year of the Maroon Coats organization, comprised of a select group of highly involved student leaders that serve as the student ambassadors of the Texas A&M Foundation. The group enhances the impact of the Foundation through stewardship and service. Their duties include interacting with donors at special events, providing a student perspective



during fundraising meetings, writing thank you notes to donors, and hosting donors or friends of the Foundation on campus visits. Joining David was Shannon Zwernemann '03, Maroon Coats Advisor.

Basketball Season


